Executive Summary

The purpose of this report is to inform Council that the Aurora Museum & Archives has partnered with the York Region District School Board (YRDSB) to develop and host a Regional Heritage Fair at the Stronach Aurora Recreation Complex (SARC) on Saturday, May 13, 2017 from 10:00 a.m. - 3:00 p.m.

Background

The York District School Board has revived their Heritage Fair program for students as part of the celebrations for Canada 150. The Aurora Museum & Archives approached the organizers of this event to partner for this event as an opportunity to showcase Aurora's History and Heritage as per the Museum's mandate.

Analysis

Local Students to Explore History

YRDSB's Regional Heritage Fair provides students with opportunities to engage in historical/geographical inquiry to explore stories of our diverse population. Grades 5, 6, 7, 8 and 10 students have been given an assignment to research an area of the history of Ontario and/or Canada (with a particular emphasis on Canada 150), and present their discoveries using mediums of their choice (diorama, performance piece, web-based project, video, PowerPoint presentation, display board etc.). Students will first be presenting their projects at their respective schools. Eleven schools from the Region

are taking part including Dr. G.W. Williams High School in Aurora. The Town's Curator will be acting as a judge for this qualifying event on Thursday, May 4, 2017. Projects that have won their school fairs will be displayed/presented as part of the Regional Heritage Fair and compete with other students in the Region on May 13, 2017.

This event will allow participants to share their new learning as well as take part in a variety of experiential learning workshops. The Aurora Museum & Archives has met with representatives from the Aurora Historical Society, Sharon Temple, and the Aurora Sports Hall of Fame to coordinate a series of hands-on workshops for the students. Students will be able to learn about and actively participate in a variety of activities including deciphering primary documents relating to WWI and practicing their cursive writing; examining the social custom of calling cards and creating their own printed version; learning about the 1837 Upper Canada Rebellion and creating their own Rebellion Boxes, among other activities offered by local area museums, archives and historical organizations. During the day students will have a presentation time where they will present to the judges, or a single judge assigned to review their project. The day will include activities that are currently being planned, and end with the winners being announced.
